School Bus Idling

Board Policy: A-39 Adopted: December 12, 2005

I. General Policy Statement

The Haywood County Board of Education recognizes that unnecessary bus idling poses a health risk to the students and the driver. Further, the Board recognizes that a school bus idling policy not only reduces fuel consumption and cost, but also reduces emissions resulting in cleaner air for everyone.

II. Guidelines

- 1. Warm up time in the morning will be kept to a minimum of 3-5 minutes except in the coldest of weather. This follows the manufacturer's recommendations.
- 2. Upon arrival to the school, each bus must be turned off before unloading the students.
- 3. Buses will not be running during the loading process on the school campus in the afternoon.
- 4. Buses should not be parked nose to tail when possible; this causes the bus behind to fill up with exhaust fumes.
- 5. Drivers will not leave the bus idling un-attended. The driver must be in the drivers seat if the bus is running.
- 6. When leaving the campus in the afternoon, there must be several bus lengths between each departing bus. This provides enough space for the exhaust to escape and is a DMV requirement.
- 7. Buses should not be parked within 100 feet of an active school air intake system.
- 8. All drivers will be provided a copy of the guidelines by the transportation director or designee at the beginning of each school year and when new drivers are hired.
